To understand where Salt Lake Community College is headed, it is important to understand the history of the college:

1948

Salt Lake Community College opened its doors, initially designed as a vocational school to train veterans returning home from WWII. Today, it is the largest two-year college in the state.

1959

The school was renamed Salt Lake Trade Technical Institute, consistently believing that higher education should be accessible to everyone.

1967

Redwood Campus opens.

1969

The school received full accreditation from the Northwest Association of Colleges and Universities.

1972

A two-year associate degree in nursing was introduced.

1987

Governor Norm Bangerter signed a bill to create Salt Lake Community College.

1991

South City Campus opens.

1999

Miller Campus opens.

2001

Jordan Campus opens.

2022

School of Applied Technology is renamed Salt Lake Technical College.

2023

75th-year anniversary.

Herriman Campus opens with the first building, Juniper Building.

Today

- It is the largest two-year college in the state.
- More than 78% of students work while attending school.
- Tuition fees are proactively kept low.
- 81% of students graduate with little to no student debt.
- SLCC is an Emerging Hispanic Serving Institution, Utah's first public institution to qualify as such.

Through these guiding principles, the college is leaving an important mark on both education and the communities it serves.



Dedicated Capital Funds Project Priorities

Project #1

South City Campus Seismic Upgrade - to structurally retrofit the old portion of the South City Campus main building: \$90,000,000 - \$100,000,000. SLCC to pursue FEMA funding, dedicated state funds to cover approximately 25% of project costs.

Project #2

Jordan Campus Classroom Building – to support the growth of the Health Sciences programs and general education courses on Jordan Campus 40,000 – 60,000 square feet: \$27,000,000 - \$40,500,000.

Project #3

Taylorsville/Redwood Campus Remodel and Modernize the Technology Building Infrastructure (no new added space) \$27,000,000. Portion of project has been completed with capital improvement funding.

Project #4

Herriman Classroom Building – to support regional growth in the southwest quadrant of Salt Lake Valley 40,000 – 60,000 square feet \$27,000,000 - \$40,500,000.

Project #5

Westpointe Campus Aviation Building – to support the growth in the northwest quadrant of Salt Lake Valley 40,000 – 60,000 square feet \$27,000,000 - \$40,500,000.

Remodel of the Lifetime Activities Center on the Taylorsville Redwood Campus. Potential bonding \$15,000,000.

Motorcycle Program Building on the Miller or Jordan Campus. Approximately \$3,000 sq. ft.: \$2,000,000.

Implementing these strategies will enable SLCC to better meet the needs of its students, enhance the educational experience, and create a vibrant and thriving campus community.


Methodology

Salt Lake Community College plans major expansions at its Taylorsville campus, including new buildings, student housing, a transit hub, improved traffic flow, and more green space, to meet growing student demands and enhance campus life.



Salt Lake Community College plans two new building sites and a future addition to accommodate growing demands, enhancing students' educational experiences and their engagement with the vibrant urban environment.



Salt Lake Community College's Jordan campus plans new buildings for General Education, Health Science, and Recreation, alongside a running trail, community garden, recreation center, sports court, infrastructure improvements, and traffic enhancements to enrich student life.



A new facility building is planned for the northwest corner of the Miller campus to support evolving service needs, and the campus is also a prime contender for a new motorcycle building to enhance its offerings, though the final location is yet to be determined.



The Westpointe campus expansion will include two new academic buildings, an aviation building, and a central pedestrian core to improve accessibility, community vibrancy, and support for students and faculty.



The Herriman Campus is a vibrant, sustainable academic and social hub featuring multiple proposed building sites including, a central student commons, a dedicated administrative building, and a pavilion/amphitheater, all designed to foster community engagement and environmental integration.

Proposed Westpointe Campus






