Christina Holm has been working at SLCC for about one year now. Before joining SLCC, she worked for 10 years at Kennesaw State University as a liaison librarian, instruction coordinator, team leader, and Associate Professor. She often serves on curriculum committees, leads the SoTL fellows, works with others on library curriculum development, represents Academic Services on library leadership, and helps with Collection Development teamwork. She likes that she can solve problems regularly in her role and think about how systems are interconnected with each other. Christina is often thinking about how a student or person with an outside perspective may view something. Since patrons may not have the same level of library knowledge as a trained professional, remembering that information should be accessible is something that she takes very seriously.

Christina says library studies is a field one develops many different skills on the job. A librarian may be teaching themselves coding and programing software for one minute, then working on promotional marketing the next. There have been times

when she utilizes her knowledge in Python or HTML coding to get projects done and is also willing to learn more skills. She believes that some knowledge in statistics and teaching can be useful. A recent successful project she participated in at SLCC is the implementation of the library Escape Room. These were run for the STEM Summer Bridge Orientation. It was fun and had the goal to help students get a greater understanding of library services in a positive, memorable way through methodical puzzles and strategic learning – it was a huge success.
