
UWHEN Leadership

- Took over the university's Red Handed Award out of retirement and over 60 individuals were nominated in the first two

- More than 50% of SUU College Deans are now female.
- Women in leadership positions at SUU is up 4% over the last five years.

UWHEN Engagement

- · Sponsored three State Board positions
- Attended state-wide UWHEN events including 2019 Annual Leadership Conference

- USU over the past year has been actively committed to a presidential initiative promoting diversity and
 inclusion. In late 2019 a campus climate survey was conducted with the purpose of understanding the USU
 campus climate and an important step toward ensuring our institution's success and commitment to
 employees and students. Additionally President Cockett established a Diversity and Inclusion Task Force.
 The data from the survey informed the Diversity and Inclusion Task Force and established priorities for a
 five-year strategic plan, the ultimate goal being the creation of a campus climate where everyone feels safe,
 welcomed, valued, and respected.
- Taskforce members conducted analysis of strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT) around key issues impacting employees and students. Throughout 2020 these taskforce initiatives have influenced seminars, lectures, and efforts to promote diversity and inclusion including a university wide Inclusion and Diversity Symposium week-long effort.









- Hosted two Women's Leadership Lunch Seminars. Fall speaker was UVU President Tuminez and spring speaker was Nylan McBain, who shared stories of women in Utah's history (148 attended the first and 123 the second).
- Inaugurated Female Faculty Forums, co-sponsored by the Office of Teaching and Learning and the Women's Success
 Center. Two events per semester. The first event is intended to guide tenure-track female faculty and connect with female full
 professors, who can provide guidance. The second is a research discussion group designed to facilitate idea sharing and build
 community among female faculty. (Over 30 attendees)
- Hosted Fall/Spring Networking Socials, one featuring Linda Makin presenting on ElevateHER (95 attendees) and the second focused on goal setting (31 attendees).
- Hosted book soirees, meeting three times a semester, How Women Rise in fall and Becoming in spring.

- Jessi Hill from UVU is a co-founder of the USHE Women's Leadership Exchange program, which provides opportunities for leadership development and professional mentorship and pairs mid-career women with high potential to emerge as leaders with women or men already in leadership positions within USHE.
- In Fall 2019, UVU implemented a new **Masters of Education in Higher Education Leadership** to provide graduate education opportunity for aspiring leaders, particularly females.
- The Women's Success Center created a gallery display called "Modern Suffrage" in conjunction with the anniversary of Utah women voting and the 19th Amendment..
- As a part of Martin Luther King Jr. Week, UVU's MLK Commemoration Committee, along with the Center for Social Impact and BSU, created exhibits on Black women who were trailblazers. Their theme was, "Democratizing the Dream: Black Women in Movements."
- Promoted equal numbers of female and male participants in the Utah Valley Senior Executive Leaders
 Forum (UVSELF) which provides mentor and learning opportunities for faculty and staff.







- Worked with the annual UWHEN conference planning committee to host the 2020 UWHEN Leadership Conference (cancelled).
- Supported attendance at 2019 UWHEN Leadership Conference.
- Regularly communicated leadership training opportunities to over 800 WSU women through email listserv.
- Hosted fall networking event: In My Shoes: Quick Connections, Lasting Impact (55 participants).
- Partnered with WSU's Stewart Library's Archives and Special Collections to provide the exhibit: *Women of Weber*, for display at the 2020 UWHEN Leadership Conference.


