



- In October 2022, Ensign College distributed a survey to all FT & PT women associated with the campus to gauge the campus community's interest in campus meetings and UWHEN workshops/events; 48 responses were received showing interest in being involved
- Secured a UWHEN budget of \$2,000 for 2022-23 academic year to support engagement of the Ensign community



- Utah Women & Leadership Project held 7 Women's Leadership Forum Series events throughout the
  past year. Topics included women and leadership, promotion, emotional health, salary negotiation,
  returning to the workforce, and career exploration
- Utah Women & Leadership Project held a book club, three virtual workshops, a childcare symposium, and International Women's Day Celebration: Utah Women Learn, Lead, & Lift
- Susan Polster, a professor at the USU Eastern campus in Price, made USU history as the first department head headquartered outside of Logan.
- Utah State University is participating in the Utah Women's Leadership Exchange (UWLE). UWLE aims to provide help for women to thrive in leadership roles.
- Utah State University celebrated exceptional faculty at the 2022 Faculty Awards Ceremony. 10 of the 11 institutional award recipients were women.













- 9 UVU Chapter events engaging 630 attendees.
- **2 Women's Leadership Speaker** events. In Fall: Justice Paige Petersen of the Utah Supreme Court shared how personal growth and leadership depend on getting out of your comfort zone. In Spring: Utah Representative Angela Romero addressed how one should discover their own leadership style.
- **Multiple additional events** covering topics like *Reconnecting in a Post-COVID Workplace*, *Empowering Women as Agents of Change*, *Crucial Conversations*, and *SRI's*, *Feedback*, *and Bias*.

- **Clifton Strengths Workshops** in partnership with PACE (Professional Association of Campus Employees). 45 participants in Spring.

- UVU administrative leadership added two female Vice President (total 4 of 8) and a female Dean for the School of the Arts (total 3 of 8).
- The Presidents of UVUSA (student government), Faculty Senate, and PACE (Staff association) are all women.
- UVU Roots of Knowledge Speaker Series focused on women and featured female presenters.
- Launched a monthly newsletter from UVU's Women's Council
- Graduated a record number of female students
- Women's Success Center raised over \$500,000 for scholarships





- WSU Chapter hosted a 2022 UWHEN Statewide Annual Leadership Conference: *Navigating New Spaces* watch party which included breakfast, lunch, and networking.
- President Brad Mortensen gave an introduction to the conference, which streamed to all attendees throughout the state.
